Throughout the 2017-18 season, we will be celebrating our past and pondering our future. Recently retired from McGill University after 42 years, **Susan Button** started as a secretary in the Faculty of Graduate Studies & Research and went on to work on the History of McGill Project, helping Dr. Stanley Frost in the creation of *McGill University: For the Advancement of Learning*. She then worked in Development and Alumni Relations for 32 years, while earning a degree in psychology. Susan has been a member of the

Executive Council of the James McGill Society since 1977. In 2004, she was awarded an Honorary Life Membership in the McGill Alumni Association. Susan is delighted to be a member of the UWCM and is currently serving as membership chair, having already served as secretary. "My years of volunteer service have been immensely rewarding," she says. "I never stop learning and I am constantly enriched by the people I meet."



After obtaining her nursing education in London, **Pam Georges** came to Montreal from England in the seventies and got her master's of adult education. During her professional career in Montreal, Pam was director of nursing for 27 years and a surveyor with the Canadian Council on Health Accreditation. Pam joined the UWCM in 1989 and, over the years, has participated in many activities and initiatives, including being president from 2000 to 2002. She is proud that it was during this time that the board established our mission

statement that still serves us today (see below). Pam was the convenor of several interest groups over the years, like Antiquing for Fun, Painters Corner and Travels With My Aunt. She is an artist, specializing in watercolour, and has been an avid antique collector. When she is not travelling, she divides her time between her home in Montreal, her cottage in the Eastern Townships and her flat outside London, England. Dr. Richard Fraser: *Dr. Maude Abbott, One of Our Founding Members*

Professor of pathology, Richard Fraser (BSc '69, MDCM '76) is now curator of the Maude Abbott Medical Museum of McGill University, founded in 1922. This museum was named in honour of Dr. Maude Abbott (1869-1940), one of the first women to receive a BA from McGill University and — not incidentally! — one of the founding members, in 1927, of

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear colleagues,

As we welcome a new season, I wish to thank you for your enthusiasm in supporting our new projects as well as the activities organized for you by our interest groups. Your participation in the club's sustainability is key to our success, so let's make it happen!

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate three of our members whose leadership has been acknowledged nationally.

First, UWCM has nominated the Honourable Anne-Marie Trahan for the CFUW 100th anniversary notable woman award (2019). Besides an outstanding career path in law at the national and international levels, Anne-Marie has been instrumental in starting or supporting organizations that promote social justice, children's rights and the arts. She has several medals and awards to her credit including the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal. A member of UWCM, Anne-Marie has been very active as president and treasurer. She has also been Quebec Council VP and a CFUW board member.

Secondly, our Social Media Chair Earlyn Sharpe has been promoted to the role of Associate Director of Education at Karonhianónhnhwa Ionterihwaienstákhwa. According to the press release "... [she] has proven to be an exceptional leader in her past three years as principal of Karonhianónhnhwa... Earlyn and her school team have been recognized with the highest honour by

The Learning Partnership's National Awards Selection Committee..." As an Associate Director of Education, Earlyn will be responsible for "supervising, overseeing and supporting school improvement initiatives, working with schools' administration teams to provide educational leadership in highly effective pedagogical approaches to learning; supporting and supervising the administration of outside (post-secondary and adult education) services; and supporting the Director of Education in building an education centre responsive to the needs of the schools under its supervision."

Finally, Vice-President Nadia Ramundo has been invited by CFUW to offer online training to all clubs across Canada on how to make a video using Biteable software. (Just a reminder that UWCM pioneered these Biteable videos by collaborating with our John Molson student partner Slavena Kiryakova.) Our first video using this software was published and shared with all clubs last July 30th to commemorate World Day Against Trafficking in Persons. Slavena will join Nadia in organizing and delivering the online training for CFUW clubs.

Hats off to these leaders who, once again, have shown the power of women working together!


