CFUW NAMES 100 NOTABLE WOMEN IN HONOUR OF ITS 100th ANNIVERSARY

Two UWCM members were given this honour



Saôde Savary

A member of the Ordre des Chimistes du Québec with over 30 years' experience in chemical risk management, Saôde joined the UWCM in 2015 and became vice-president in 2016, when she created a women's issues blog for our website. That same year, she co-authored and presented, on behalf of the Quebec Council, a brief on the New Policy on Educational Success to the Ministère de l'Éducation.

As president, Saôde joined the CFUW International Committee and the CFUW-UN delegation. She participated in the Assessment of Sexual Assault Policies in Canadian Post-Secondary Institutions and the Survey of the Status of Female Faculty and Students at Canadian Universities. She joined CFUW's Advocacy – Environment and Climate Change Sub-Committee, redesigned our website, and increased its bilingual content. She launched the first North American edition of the Olympes de la Parole high school competition that won the CFUW Special Project Award in 2018.

Anne-Marie had been nominated by the UWCM board as a CFUW "Notable Woman" late last year.

We are sure she would have loved to have been in Winnipeg to celebrate with fellow members. Her award will be framed and presented to her family.

L'honorable A.M. Trahan était juge retraitée de la Cour supérieure du Québec. Elle a obtenu son diplôme en droit de l'Université de Montréal en 1967. Durant son illustre carrière, elle a travaillé à la Direction du droit commercial international de l'ONU à Vienne et à la Commission canadienne des transports. Sous-ministre déléguée au ministère de la Justice du Canada (1986-1994), elle a ensuite siégé à la Cour supérieure du Québec (1994-2010). Première femme à présider l'Association internationale des jeunes avocats (AIJA), elle a également présidé le Cercle de droit européen de la Chaire Jean Momet de l'Université de Montréal et été membre du Conseil de Direction d'UNIDROIT (Institut international pour l'unification du droit privé).

Recently deceased (on July 12), Anne-Marie had been recognized by the Department of Justice for her commitment to Canada's linguistic and legal duality (1999), she received the Paul-André Crépeau Medal for her contribution to the advancement of the international aspects of private law and commercial law in Canada (2008), and the Highest Distinction Award for the Advancement of Women at the 2002 Gala "Women of Distinction Awards" organized by the Women's Y Foundation of Montreal. After retiring, Maître Trahan devoted her time to her passion for music. She was the founding president of Opéra Piccola, created a bursary in lyrical singing at Université de Montréal's music faculty and supported numerous community music events. In addition to being a *membre du conseil de direction du Centre de recherches en droit public* (U de M) and the *Conseil canadien pour la santé infantile*, she served as vice president of General Insurance Ombudservice.

She was an active member of the CFUW since 1964, first on the AFDU Montréal club executive for 12 years, VP Québec from 1976 to 1979 and more recently, the UWCM. Most recently, she was a strong supporter of Stella Musica and Les Olympes de la Parole.

The new dinner venue is La Classe, 2000 Sainte Catherine Street West, Montreal. The restaurant is located below main floor. Elevators are accessible by asking the concierge on the main floor. La Classe has a cozy, contemporary atmosphere and is listed on Open Table and Diner's Choice.

Free parking is located on Fort Street, on the right just after 1390 du Fort Street.

Reservations must be made by contacting Program Chair, Maria Masi,. The deadline is the Friday prior to the scheduled dinner meetings.

With 40 or more UWCM diners (members and guests), the restaurant will be reserved for our group alone. If fewer than 40 members (and guests), the restaurant will open the remaining tables to the public. Let's do our best to always be at least 40 people at every dinner meeting!

As usual, UWCM dinner meetings will begin at 18:00 with seating at 19:00.
