


TRAVEL CLUB




November Dinner Speaker

Alexa Ruel is a PhD Candidate in Psychology and past Public Scholar at Concordia University in Montreal, Canada. She has a BA in Psychology from McGill University and a Master's in Experimental Psychology from Concordia University.

Alexa's primary research is in decision-making strategies and cognitive control changes during healthy aging. She is currently involved in projects examining the neural mechanism supporting the shift towards model-free decision-making in older adults. She is also investigating how different cognitive abilities relate to decision-making and how individuals of different ages learn following some surprising events.

She is the Founder of Concordia's Journal of Accessible Psychology and Co-founder of Concordia's Journal of Psychology and Neuroscience.


Annual Giving Campaign letters were mailed late last month. The campaign runs until the end of June next year.
